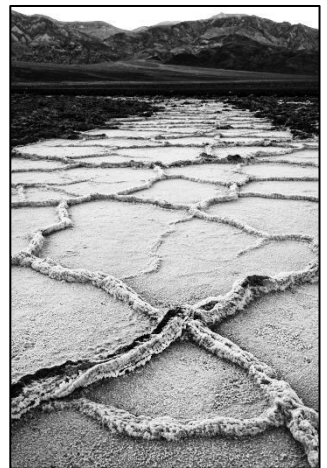

**Free Form Photo Discussion:** A safe place where photographic artist's gather to discuss their work in small groups. You know the situation:

- There is one photo that haunts you, you can't leave it alone, you can't decide why it works, or doesn't work and you need input from the group.
- You are thinking of a project or series but want to bounce around the ideas
- Your Muse has deserted you just when you needed her most.

**How does it work?** Salon 88 is free, but limited to the first 10 registrants. Bring one mounted print no smaller than 11x14 and no larger than 12x18 that has not been shared previously in a CPA class. This should be new work! Be prepared to discuss why you chose this photo and what you want to know from the group. Be prepared to give those answers to your Salon partners. Sorry, no voyeurs.
